Axis Multicap Fund – Three years of wealth creation Journey

(An open ended equity scheme investing across large cap, midcap, small cap stocks)

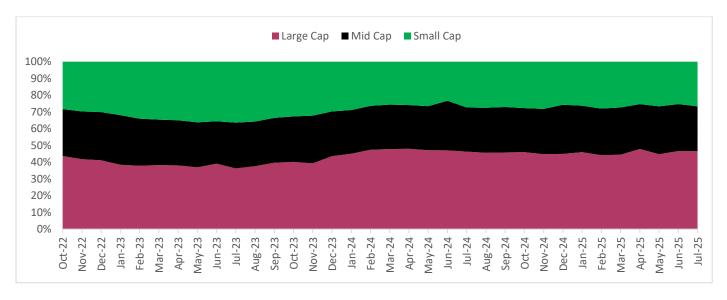

Investment approach

- Investment across the entire market capitalization curve and in a disciplined manner
- Target companies that have the potential to become leaders
- · Aims to capture opportunities moving from unorganized to organized
- Aims to capture the ideas regardless of size
- Target leaders or challengers in respective market segments

How the fund is being managed?

True to its name and mandate, the Fund has invested across the market capitalization curve taking active calls to shift between the market caps based on Fund Manager's views.

Since its inception, the fund has increased its allocation to small-cap stocks, reaching a peak of 36% by late 2023. However, this allocation has since been reduced to 25%-26% in last one year. Over the last year, exposure to small cap has come off on account of two aspects:

- Small cap stocks moving up the curve into Mid cap segment.
- We have also actively trimmed our allocation in the small cap segment, as we believe high-quality mid and small caps have turned expensive and large caps are more compelling investment.

Similarly, the fund initially allocated ~50% to large-cap stocks but decreased this allocation throughout 2022 and 2023. In 2024, the fund began to increase its large-cap allocation once again.

The valuation in Mid and Small cap stocks continue to remain high. Currently, the Midcap 1 yr fwd PE is at +1 SD while that of the Smallcap is above +2 SD*. Earnings growth has remained weak in the current earning session. However, valuation in large cap is less of a concern and hence it is an attractive space. Accordingly, the fund holds 46% in large cap, 27% in midcap and 26% in Smallcap, diversified across 121 stocks.

Fund Positioning—Portfolio Changes

The fund focuses on high-conviction ideas across market caps and has dynamically adjusted its sector allocations to capitalize on market opportunities. we believe that market is currently in a consolidation phase, with selected pockets of opportunity. The fund accordingly increased its allocation to high conviction stocks/themes. This reflects in top 5 holding which increased from 16% to 19% in last one year. As market experienced both performance cycle in last one year, we believe market dynamics have completely changed, it's no longer broad-based market with multiple themes working. Rather this is more stock specific market. The fund has also changed its positioning in line with it. Fund has largely increased its positioning in banks and electronic equipment's. We have strong conviction in Leisure services, healthcare services, Pharma and Retails.

Portfolio Action

The fund uses bottom-up stock selection process and invest in high quality and high ROE businesses with steady earnings (large caps) and with a blend of niche companies as well as scalable business models backed by strong fundamentals (mid & small caps).

Our PE ratio in comparison to the benchmark is optically high mainly on account of a few stocks in the portfolio that have a significantly high current PE like PB Fintech, Hitachi, Jubliant Foodworks, Eternal etc. However, the fund also boasts higher earnings and similar ROE, indicating stronger potential profitability and efficiency.

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What worked for Fund?

The market rebound was primarily led by momentum stocks—those that had experienced sharp declines during the earlier fall. As these stocks bounced back, the fund saw some short-term impact, as it stick to its quality style. Despite this temporary pressure, the fund's long-term outlook remains robust.

In Comparison to the benchmark, a large portion of our portfolio's outperformance can be attributed to the selection effect. Our stock selection particularly in the capital goods, services and healthcare segment has positively contributed to our performance.

Way Forward

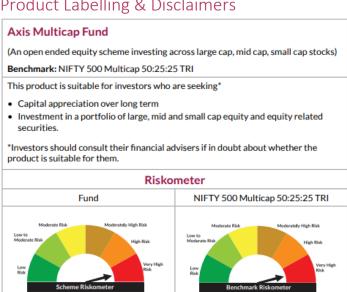
As expected, global economy focus has shifted to evolving geopolitical tensions, the impact of policy changes and tariff implementation. We believe at this juncture; impact of the global events is highly unpredictable. We believe that domestic growth stories will remain resilient, especially for companies delivering strong earnings growth. Portfolio tilt is towards companies with higher dependence on domestic markets/consumers and expanding addressable market opportunities.
